Background

For the past 3 years, our APPEAR project *Rooting Development in the Palestinian Context* (<http://rootingdevelopment.com/>) has steadily sought to stimulate debates on Palestinian development by seeking to offer an alternative and critical reading of development after the Oslo accords. The Palestinian youth who lead this debate come from different areas in Palestine as well as from Palestinian communities in Jordan and Lebanon.

The conference brings together these efforts to promote critical knowledge and a collective dialogue on development. By exchanging experiences, the sessions will explore how current models, practices, resources and knowledge from different communities can strengthen popular forms of development, as well as collective consciousness and practices.

Hence, the conference will create a space of debate between researchers, academics, and community activists in order to exchange knowledge and amplify the views of the youth involved in the project, thus solidifying the role of research and critical knowledge in promoting social change.

The high importance of rooting development in the Palestinian context has demanded the shift to a dialogue based on Palestinian experiences in development within the current economic, political and social contexts.

Aims of the conference are as follows:

- To deepen the understanding of communal experiences and knowledge to solidify a Palestinian vision of alternative development, and
- To link different knowledge producers and draw conclusions on three years of work in communal dialogues and activities in the different localities in the West Bank, the Gaza Strip, Jordan, and Lebanon.
