

The city of Fulda

Costs

- <u>Tuition fee:</u> The University is funded by the state, students pay no tuition fees.
- <u>Enrolment fee:</u> approx. €300 per semester including the semester ticket for public transportation in and around Fulda
- <u>Cost of living:</u> €700–€800 per month, including rent, health insurance (€90 per month), depending on living standard
- ☑ Job opportunities: There are good job opportunities in the nearby Rhine-Main area, which is one of the strongest employment regions in Germany. Teaching assistantships can be offered to good students.

Content

The new international Master's degree programme in Human Rights Studies in Politics, Law and Society (MAHRS) is a social science-based and interdisciplinary graduate programme that looks at human rights issues from various perspectives.

During their first year, students will examine the history, development and institutionalisation of human rights.

Additionally, students acquire substantial expertise in social sciences methodology and legal argumentation. Human rights will be related to social change, cross-cultural interaction and communication. The second year starts with a ten-week internship that can be completed in Germany or abroad.

Afterwards, students specialise in two of the following areas: business and work and human rights, migration and human rights or (digital) communication and human rights. Cross studies will bring participants together with students from other graduate programmes and foreign languages can be studied throughout the programme.

In their Master's thesis, which will be supervised by two members of the department, students work on a research topic developed during their studies or their internship.

Programme structure

MAHRS is aimed at German and international graduates with a first degree in social sciences, politics, law, communication, philosophy, social work or economics. Approximately 70% of the classes will be taught in German, and 30% in English. Therefore, good skills in both languages are required. Thirty students can be admitted to the programme each year.

The standard programme duration is four semesters (two years), with an internship undertaken after the second semester in an

organisation, institution, public authority or company that is relevant to human rights or actively involved with human rights issues.

The programme consists of eleven modules. The Master's thesis is written in the fourth semester. The academic title of Master of Arts (MA) is awarded after all modules have been successfully completed.
