## Call for Visiting Researchers – Norwegian Centre for Human Rights

Through our joint NORHED II project, Partnership for Peace: Better Higher Education for Resilient Societies, the Norwegian Centre for Human Rights, shall invite applications for the researcher exchange programme for the period 2022-2026.

## The Norwegian Centre for Human Rights

The Norwegian Centre for Human Rights ('NCHR' or 'the Centre') is a multidisciplinary Centre in the Faculty of Law, University of Oslo (UiO). Its main activities include research, teaching, and applied human rights work in the form of thematic training and capacity building. Human rights education and research contributes to the long-term prevention of human rights abuses and represents an important investment in efforts to achieve a just society in which everyone's human rights are valued and respected. The Centre is an internationally recognised academic institution in the field of human rights. As part of its main research activities, NCHR hosts two Faculty Research Groups and publishes the Nordic Journal of Human Rights, a flagship multidisciplinary publication. NCHR's two-year Master programme in 'Theory and Practice of Human Rights' educates students from all over the world. NCHR offers various courses and training on human rights and international humanitarian law for students, as well as for human rights professionals. NCHR's International Department is responsible for the applied human rights work in cooperation with other academic institutions, civil society and NGOs.

## The call for visiting researchers for 2022

We will host a total of seven guest researchers (PhD or junior faculty) for the whole project period 2022-2026, one guest researcher in even years and two in odd years. We will be hosting one guest researcher in 2022. The Norhed-financing will cover travel and accommodation costs, as well as a per diem. The research exchange can last up to two months (60 days).

We will have an annual application deadline. The **deadline for the 2022 visiting researchers** is **Thursday, 6 January 2022**. When applying for a guest research placement, please include the following information:

- A short CV (two pages maximum);
- A letter of motivation, explaining how this exchange is relevant to your PhD research project or research interests, including tentative activities for your stay;
- Please also indicate which time during the year are possible/preferable for your exchange.

We have three guiding principles in the participant selection process, namely the strength of the candidate; the relevance of the research stay for the candidates' research and match with our institution; and gender balance within each institution and in the researchers' mobility scheme as a whole.
